Responsibility- always prepared for school & for class



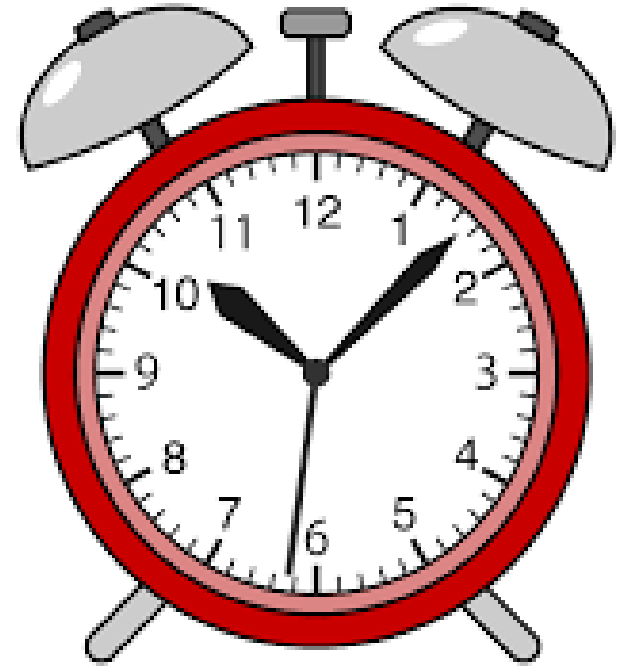
Arrive to school prepared for the day.

- Parent contact is made.





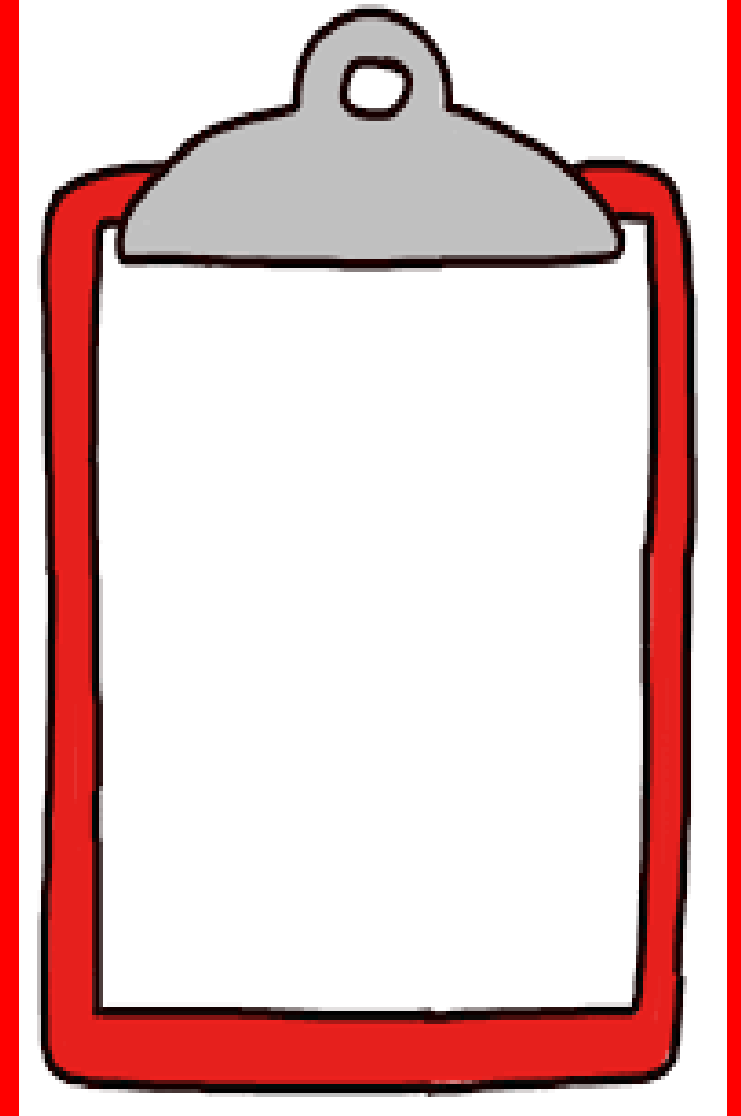
Dress Code Policy and Tardy to Class Policy:*

Procedures to see Ms. Young or Mr. Melancon

- Sign-up in the office
- Fill out a form
- You will be called when either is available.



Procedures to see the counselor, Ms. Licona

- Fill out a counselor form in an elective class. Report to the office with the form. Ms. Nancy or Ms. Becky will call Mrs. Licona to see if she is available.
- Or fill out the Google form How Are You Feeling in Mrs. Licona's Google classroom; and she will speak to you during an elective class.



Procedures to see the school Nurse

- Fill out a form in the classroom.
- Report to the office.
- Ms. Nancy or Ms. Becky will call the nurse to see if she is available.



Grades

70% Summative: You need a minimum of 4 grades per nine weeks.

District Unit Assessments, Teacher made assessments, Essays, Moby Max Test Prep, Major Projects, Map Skill Assessments, CER Assessment(minimum of twice a nine weeks)

30% Formative: You can split into two 15% categories.



Homework, Fluency Practice, Gizmo practices , Vocabulary quizzes, bell work, Exit tickets, Model tracking for Open Sci-Ed, Paragraphs, CER practice, Achieve—4 for progress report and 4 for end of the nine weeks



Make-up Work excused absences



- You have 5 days to make-up the work missed from your return to school.
- If you do not make-up the work, the assignments will remain a 0(F).
- It is your responsibility to ask for the work missed.

GMUES CAMPUS

- Follow the arrows on the sign in the center. Students should walk to the right, counter clockwise.
- 6th graders will walk the quad on the library side to the right.
- 7th & 8th graders will walk the quad on the cafeteria side to the right
- Only students going to classes on the Library side should cross the middle of the quad area.



Cell Phones

- You can ONLY use your cellphone before school and during your brain break!
- Bathrooms and classrooms (PE in cafe) are red zones.
- The cafeteria at lunch is a red zone.
- No Social Media use is allowed during school hours!!!

GMMS Cell Phone Policy Change: Effective 8/5/2021

Cell phones will only be allowed during morning take-in, until 7:45 A.M., and during lunch brain break time to check for messages from parents. Phones should never be used in classrooms, bathrooms, dressing rooms, and in the cafeteria. Chromebooks are now given to all students so cell phone use for educational purposes is not needed in a classroom. Students may come to the office, counselor, nurse, or administrator if they need to call home. Students that do have cell phones should have it powered off and out of sight in classrooms at all times.

Expectations of devices on campus: Refer to Policy JCDAE and IFBGBA

- Cell phones or other technology devices are prohibited during test/exams. The presence of an electronic device will be considered a testing irregularity with school consequences. Chromebooks can be used for test that are computer based.
- Electronic bullying or harassment will not be tolerated and will be subject to disciplinary and/or bullying policies.
- Cell phone or any other technology infractions will follow the LPSD student code of conduct.
- The LPSD internet/email use agreement will be strictly enforced. All school/district/classroom rules must be followed.
- The school/district assumes no liability for loss, damage, or theft to any phone/device brought to school for any purpose.
- Students agree that, while within the school campus, they will access the Internet only via the District provided Wi-Fi and not via any cellular (3g, 4g, 5g, LTE) services or other internet Wi-Fi connection.
- The use of social media will be prohibited on campus. Chromebooks are provided by GMMS so personal cell phones do not need to be used for educational purposes.

Cell phone violations using the device in a red zone

CONSEQUENCES:

First Violation: Teacher official warning and documented.

Second Violation: Teacher writes referral, notifies parent, and administration will assign an after school detention.

Third Violation: Major written referral for unauthorized use of technology, confiscation of phone, ISS, and loss of privilege to be determined by the administration.



Walk, Don't Run!

- Walk to classes and at recess.
- When transitioning to class walk in a single-file on the right-side of the walkway.



Classrooms

- Be on time for class.
- Enter classrooms silently.
- Begin on bell work immediately.

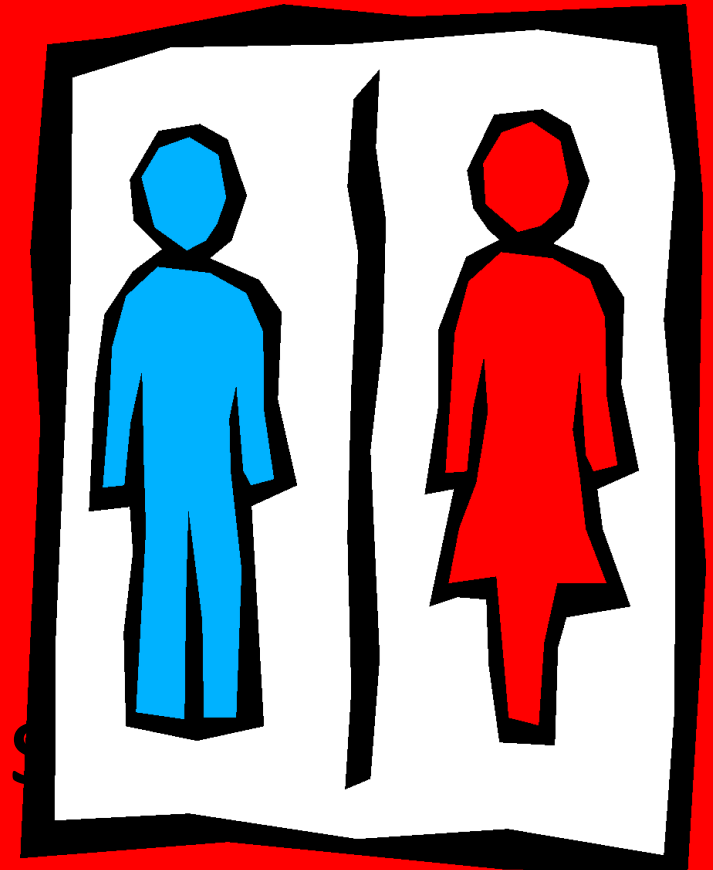
Show respect for yourself, others, and property

- This means: a fine, court and community service after school.



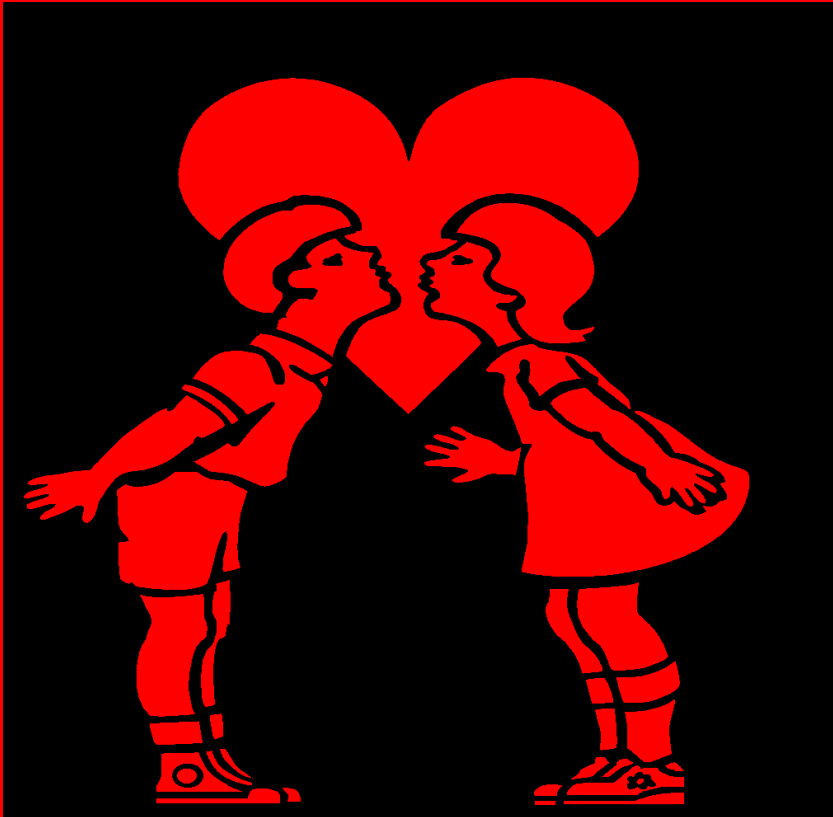
Playground Games

- Play by your grade level only.

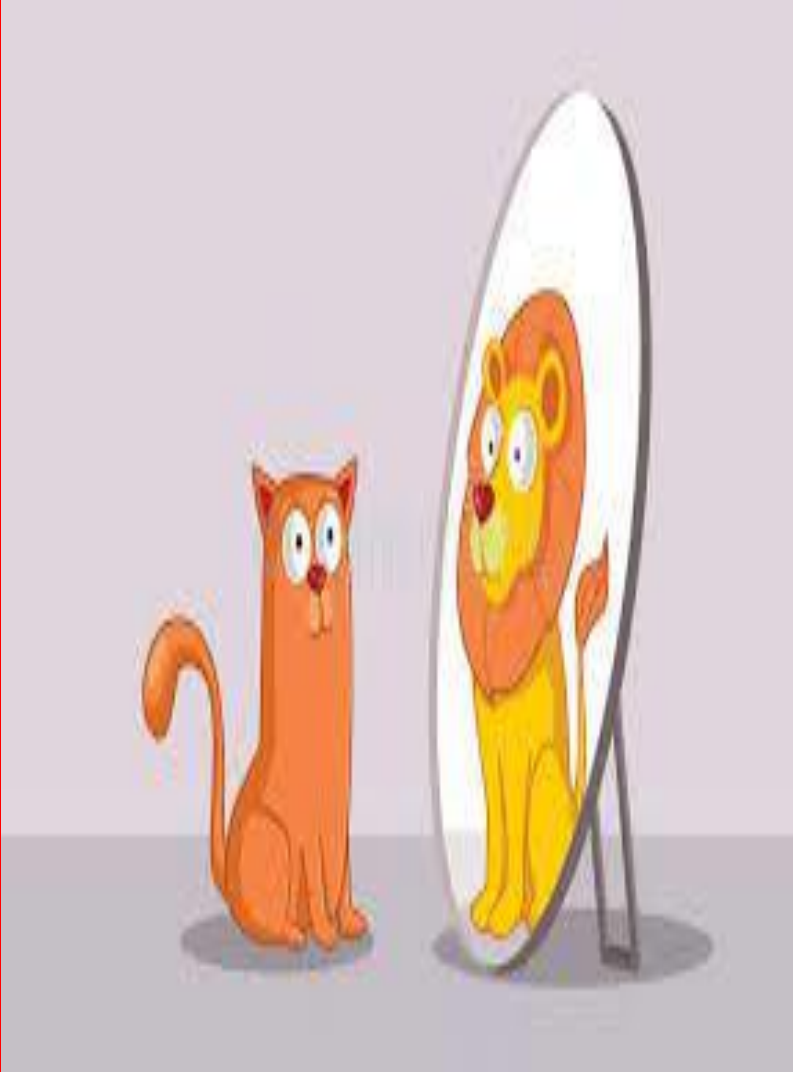


No PDA!

(Address as a "Classroom Management Issue")

1st Offense: - Verbal Warning, PBIS Intervention

2nd Offense: - Verbal Warning, *ROAR Reflection*, Parent contact

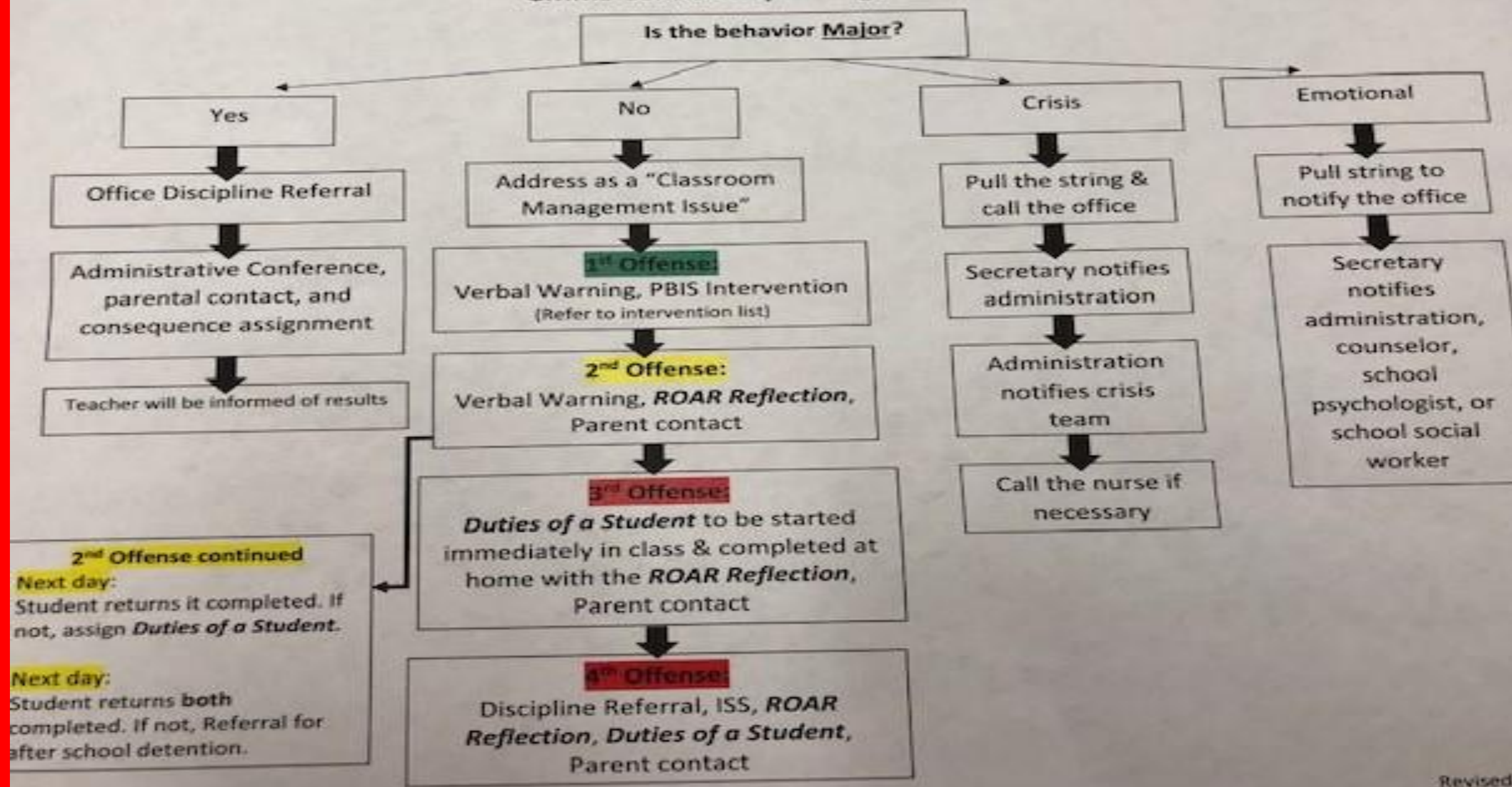
Next day: Student returns it completed. If not, assign *Duties of a Student*.

Next day: Student returns **both** completed. If not, Referral for after school detention.

3rd Offense: - *Duties of a Student* to be started *immediately* in class & completed at home with the *ROAR Reflection*, Parent contact

4th Offense: - Discipline Referral, ISS, *ROAR Reflection*, *Duties of a Student*, Parent contact

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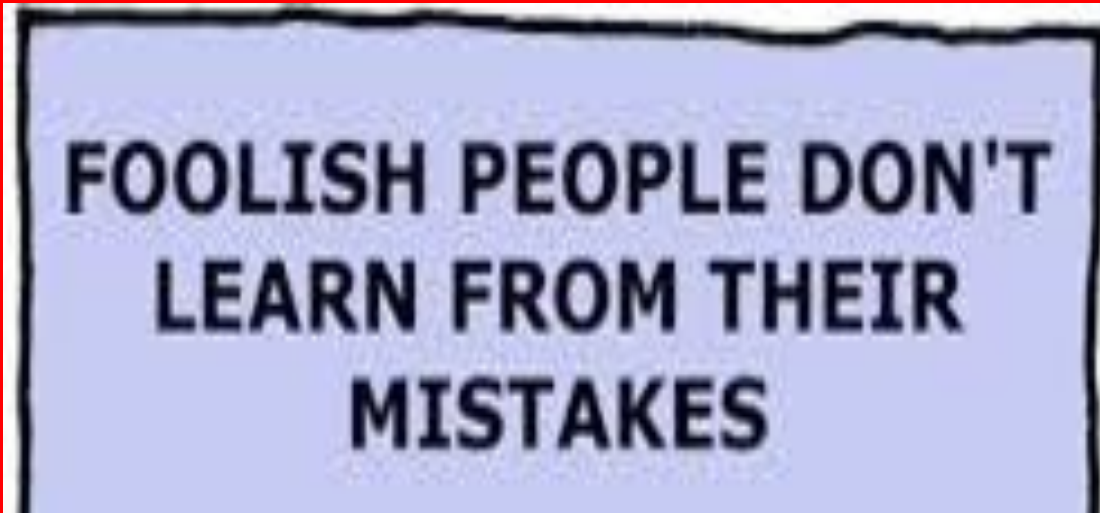
